TITLE: BOARD CODE OF CONDUCT

I. POLICY:

The Board commits itself and its members to ethical, businesslike, and lawful conduct, including proper use of authority and appropriate decorum when acting as Board Members.

II. APPLICATION: Board Members will:

- 1. Fulfill their fiduciary duties to the community and exercise discretion in a manner they reasonably believe to be in the best interests of the community.
- 2. Avoid conflict of interest with respect to their fiduciary responsibility.
- 3. Act only with the authorization of the Board as a whole, and not attempt to exercise individual authority over the organization.
- 4. Support the legitimacy and authority of the final determination of the Board on any matter, without regard to the member's personal position on the issue.
- 5. Understand the Association's Governing Documents and become educated with respect to applicable state and local laws, and to manage the Community Association accordingly.
- 6. Consistently and uniformly enforce Governing Documents, Deed Restrictions, and all applicable State and Federal Laws.
- 7. Exercise sound business judgment and follow established Management Practices, utilizing the assistance of appropriate professionals when needed.
- 8. Treat other Directors, staff and members of the community with consideration and respect.
- 9. Respect the need for confidentiality in certain issues.
- 10. Be properly prepared for Board deliberations.

- 11. Balance the needs and obligations of the community as a whole with those of individual homeowners and residents.
- 12. Establish methods to obtain input from owners and non-owner residents.
- 13. Conduct open, fair, impartial, and well-publicized elections in accordance with Best Practices.
- 14. Conduct business in a transparent manner when feasible and appropriate.
- 15. Encourage events that foster neighborliness and a sense of community.
