Meeting was called to order by Tom D'Abrosca at 9:00am

- 1. **ROLL CALL:** Zoom connection was operational for any interested public attendees, attendees noted above.
- 2. **Approval of old minutes**: Motion to approve September 12, 2022 and Budget workshop September 22, 2022 minutes made by RoseAnne Woodliff & second by Thom Lisk. Minutes were approved as written.
- 3. Owner Input None
- 4. REGULAR BUSINESS
 - a. **Treasurer Report** S. Besase presented September 2022 Treasurer's Report, noting that his internet had not been restored and may need revision. See attached report.
 - b. **Income Analysis** Total cash is noted to be a combined \$2,455,425 in reserves and operating accounts. Income has exceeded budgeted amount by approximately \$188.9K
 - c. **Expense Analysis** Expenses overall are overbudget by approximately \$62.7K, leaving a positive income overage of approximately \$115K. Please note Hurricane Ian impacts are not factored into this report.
 - d. **Reserve Analysis** S. Besase noted RWA transfers of \$600,000 this year from operating into capital reserves.
 - e. **Delinquent Property Status Update** –Manager Hedges noted continued progress on arrears retrieval. Assessment income has exceeded budget due to sales of homes in foreclosure and lien process and collection of arrears.
 - f. **CDARS Spreadsheet Analysis** CDs continue to rollover at monthly intervals. Treasurer Besase stated current CDRs interest rates are at 3.9% and he expects it to increase this year which positively impacts future interest income.
 - g. **Lien & Foreclosure Status** Current Liens and Foreclosures will continue to move forward. Jenn, RWA bookkeeper, is working with legal to stay on top of actionable items. Future new liens and foreclosures undetermined at this point.

5. OLD BUSINESS

a. Budget 2023 Income Adjustments given Hurricane Ian – The committee discussed income projections and Ian's effects on potential income streams. The Committee agreed not to change any budget line items with the knowledge that Income line items such as Transfer Fee Income, Estoppel Fee Income, Fine Fee Income, Attorney Income can be adjusted perhaps in the 2nd quarter of next year if additional income is needed. It is noted that the RWA office does not charge TRANSFER FEES for inter family

transfers or transfers to family trusts. Any additional expenses necessary for Hurricane Ian response will be handled through Operating reserve fund.

b. Audit Committee versus Random Cash Mid-Year Audit by Professional Auditor – Auditor spent a day with Manager Hedges and Jenn, the bookkeeper to review policies for handling of cash with RWA staff post audit and will provide a written report with recommendations for best practices. The report will be shared with Committee and Board.

6. New Business:

- a. **New Committee Member Application** Colleen Koppenhaver submitted an application and resume to become a Budget and Finance Committee member. *Tom D'Abrosca moved and it was seconded by Sam Besase to recommend Colleen Koppenhaver be approved by RWA BOD as a Committee Member. Motion passed unanimously.*
- 7. Individual Committee Member none.
- 8. **Adjournment** Motion to adjourn was made by Tom D'Abrosca and seconded by RoseAnne Woodliff to adjourned at 9:45am. Next meeting will be Monday, November 14, 2022 at 9:30am.
