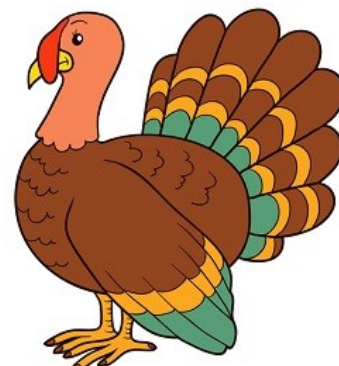

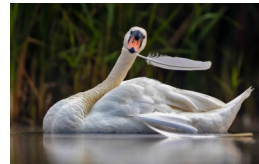

Storm Debris Pickup Status Report

CHARLOTTE COUNTY, Fla. (Oct. 18, 2022) – As of 4:30 p.m., Oct. 18, Charlotte County's debris contractor has collected 8,857 loads of vegetative debris, totaling 390,035 cubic yards of material. The debris would cover more than 18 football fields 10 feet high.

A storm debris webpage has been created that provides real-time progress of debris collection, including an interactive map showing where debris collection is and has taken place. Also included is a zone map showing the zones where pickup is active, upcoming and where the initial pass has been completed. To view the webpage and maps, visit www.CharlotteCountyFL.gov/debris.

CHARLOTTE COUNTY STORM DEBRIS REMOVAL

Curbside Storm Debris

The first initial cycle of the pickup of storm-related debris has begun with vegetative debris only. There will be additional pickup cycles for the separate debris piles. Please be patient. It will likely take several months to complete all debris removal. Keep all debris away from fire hydrants, backflow preventers or water meter boxes. Storm debris collection does not include commercial businesses.

- Debris Separation Guide ([English](#) or [Spanish](#))

Separate Storm-related Debris

Storm-related debris must be separated into piles at the curb.

Vegetative Debris (e.g., tree branches, logs, plants)

- **Do NOT place in bags.**
- Debris does not have to be bundled or cut into smaller pieces.

Construction Debris (e.g., building materials, drywall, lumber, carpet)

- **Do NOT place in bags.**
- Household chemicals cannot be placed at the curb.

Appliances & Electronics

- Remove all contents from refrigerators before placing at curbside.

Storm Debris Drop-Off

The sites accept white goods, storm-related yard or vegetation debris, and construction and demolition debris from residential properties.

- No Business or Commercial use (must use the landfill).
- No perishable waste, such as household garbage.
- No yard trimmings in bags.

Storm Debris Drop-Off Locations

Charlotte County residents can drop off storm debris from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday-Sunday (trailers cannot exceed 12 feet in length).

- **Placida West Boat Ramp (debris drop-off only, not for launching boats)**, 12560 Placida Road, Placida
- **Florida Street (south county area)**, 7000 Florida St. Punta Gorda
- **West Charlotte Mini-Transfer & Recycling Facility** (Unlimited visits until further notice), 7070 Environmental Way, Englewood
- **Mid-County Mini-Transfer & Recycling Facility** (Unlimited visits until further notice), 19765 Kenilworth Blvd., Port Charlotte

Charlotte County Landfill (Fees Apply)

- The landfill is open for business and residential waste.
- Monday-Sunday from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.

Current fees (credit cards only):

- County Residents: \$39.28 per ton (minimum charge is \$5)
- Out-of-County: \$78.54 per ton (minimum charge is \$17)
- Tires: \$125.46 per ton in-county and \$141.82 per ton out-of-county
- Asbestos: \$109.10 per ton (in-county asbestos only)
- Special Handling: \$50 per event

Newly Appointed BOD President VanScyoc Encourages Rotonda Residents to Stay Strong, Be Patient, and Help Each Other Throughout Recovery

October 13, 2022 Meeting:

- The Board of Directors accepted Patricia Aho's resignation as president of the board, and stated that she will remain a Director until her term ends in December.
- Director Andy VanScyoc was nominated and unanimously accepted to fill the position of Board President. VanScyoc stated, "That it is important to get together and work together to get through this ordeal, and although there are some grievances, that overall Rotonda is doing well."
- Election Committee asked that Candidate's Night is rescheduled due to issues caused by the storm. The Board voted and passed that Candidate's Night would be moved to November 10th.
- Director Cowin motioned to reopen Community Center on Monday, October 17th for Committee meetings, groups and clubs. This motion was passed. Board members agreed it is important to resume normal operations as soon as possible.
- Board recognized and thanked Derrick Hedges and the staff for the outstanding response and extra effort put forth by the staff members following the storm. The Community Center was used as a cool-down area, an electronic recharge spot, along with food and water hand-out station.
- President VanScyoc discussed the "**Team Player**" program. Signs will be distributed to those residents who are willing to help out with a designated need. One of the first noted would be signs posted along the canal to give the people cleaning up the canals a place to "temporarily" put the item until it can be picked up. This would help speed up the cleaning process by saving long "no wake" boat trips between pick-ups. More information to follow!



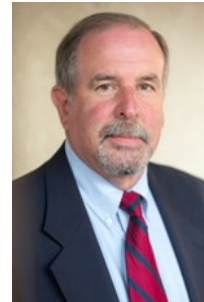

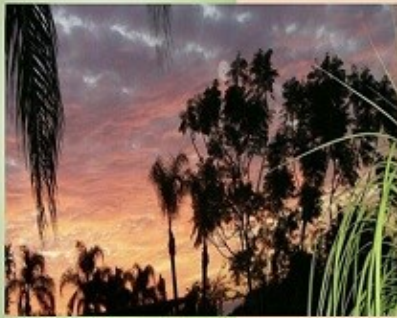

GFWC and Englewood Lions Club Hurricane Relief

After a natural disaster and when compassionate people were contacted, the efforts of two International Organizations were coordinated quickly to bring Hurricane Ian Relief to Charlotte County and beyond. GFWC Tampa Woman's Club, GFWC Lutz Land of Lakes Woman's Club and the Englewood Lions Club all worked together with GFWC Rotonda West Woman's Club to collect and distribute nonperishable food, cleaning supplies, baby needs and clothing.



Who are those GFWC people? They are some of the 8.000 members of the General Federation of Woman's Clubs throughout the state of Florida. When Charlotte County GFWC Rotonda West Woman's Club received a call from GFWC Tampa Woman's Club to ask what they needed for Hurricane Relief, within three days they received a super-sized van and a loaded 26 ft. U-Haul Truck at the Englewood Lions Club. All

items were collected by GFWC partners throughout Hillsborough County, whose vehicles picked up donations at 31 different donations and brought them to the Tampa Woman's Club to be loaded onto the truck.



Woman's Club News Continued.....

Friday morning, October 14th, the truck arrived at the Englewood Lions Club where President Dave Goll along with Lion's member Gary Nieskes, Bob Baran, and Dave Baran assisted 23 GFWC members from Tampa, Lutz Land O Lakes, Port Charlotte, and Rotonda West Woman's Club, worked to unload the truck and to reload vans for distribution the next day in Port Charlotte and Bonita Estero. After that, pickup trucks and SUV'S were loaded for St. Davis's Jubilee Center, St. Francis Food Ministry, Englewood Helping Hand, Project Phoenix, and the Homeless coalition.

Special thanks from the proud members of the General Federation of Women's Clubs go out to the Englewood Lion's Club for providing the collection and distribution point and for adding their kindness and muscle on behalf of the GFWC "Superwomen" and their trucks.

Hurricane Ian and other "unpredictable events" aside, the next General Meeting of the Rotonda West Woman's Club is scheduled for 10 a.m. on Thursday, November 17th at the RWA Community Center. A Social Hour takes place from 9 a.m. until 10 a.m., and all members of the community are invited to attend.
