DAYS OF THE SUPERSTARS

Fifty years ago, Rotonda West hosted the Superstars Competition. ABC Broadcasting had recently lost the rights to the NBA, so they were looking for a new idea to help fill the weekend sports programming times. Dick Button, former Olympic figure skater presented the idea of pro athletes competing in sports other than their own.

Button got in touch with Fram Oil Filters, who agreed to put up half of the sponsorship money. ABC bought the idea and decided the first competition would be a two-hour special on ABC's Wide World of Sports. The initial competition was to be held in the new community of Rotonda West. Each of the ten athletes invited would receive a quarter acre piece of land in Rotonda worth \$8,500, as well as any prize money they earned. The competitors would be selected from the ten most popular spectator sports being: baseball, football, basketball, ice hockey, auto racing, boxing, tennis, bowling, golf, and horse racing. Importantly, the athletes would not be allowed to compete in their own sport.

The competition was scheduled to be broadcast on Sunday, February 25th, 1973. The developers, Cavanagh Communities Corporation, who had provided the plot of land in Rotonda for each athlete, hosted a banquet for the athletes in the home of their vice-president, Ed McMahon which was shown on *The Tonight Show.*Continued on page 4





The competition began with ABC'S Jim McKay introducing the "Superstars at the Summit". These first events were destined to provide the most enduring memories from any of the show's ten seasons. The games kicked off with the swimming heats. This was the first look at any of the stars participating in a sport that was not their own and

no one knew what to expect. The swimmers took their place on the block, including Revson, Seagren, Killy and Frazier, the gun sounded and the competitors dove into the pool. The first sign of trouble was that Joe Frazier did a belly flop into the water. Soon the onlookers realized that Frazier did not know how to swim. The other competitors were providing a close race, but Frazier struggled to doggie paddle the length of the pool and back, finishing well behind Revson (the winner) and the other swimmers.

The other events followed including the bike race, tennis, golf, bowling, weight lifting, baseball hitting, table tennis, the 100 yard dash, and the half mile run. The winners of these events were as follows:

Swimming: Peter Revson

1973 SUPERSTARS COMPETITORS WHO WERE THEY?



Bob Seagren (b.1946) is an American pole vaulter. He competed in the 1968 Olympics and won a gold medal in the pole vault. He won 6 national AAU, and 4 NCAA titles. He was inducted into the USATF National Track & Field Hall of Fame in 1986. He won the 1973 Superstars Competition which was held in Rotonda West. His total point score was 49, and he earned \$39,700.



Jean-Claude Killy (b.1943)was a French World Cup alpine ski racer. Jean-Claude Killy dominated the sport in the 1960's. He was a triple Olympic champion at the 1968 Winter Olympics held in Grenoble, France. He also won two World Cup Titles. Jean-Claude placed second in the 1973 Superstars Competition with 28 points, earning \$23,400.



Rod Laver (b.1938) an Australian tennis player, still believed to be the best ever. Rod Laver was "king" of the tennis world in the 1960's winning ten or more titles per year from 1964-1970. Laver's 200 singles titles are still the most in tennis history. Rod was inducted into the International Tennis Hall of Fame in 1981. He placed third in the 1973 Superstar Competition with 27 points and earned \$13,100.



Peter Revson (1939-1974) An American race car driver, Peter Revson was also heir to the Revlon Cosmetics fortune. He was a two-time Formula Champ and a very successful Indianapolis 500 driver. In 1974, one year after competing in the Superstars, he died at age 35 in a pre-race warmup after his car hit a wall. Revson tied Laver for third place in the Superstars Competition with a score of 27, earning \$13,100.



Johnny Bench (b.1947) An American professional baseball player. Johnny Bench played his entire major league career (1967-1983) with the Cincinnati Reds, primarily as a catcher. He was inducted into the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1989. He placed fifth in the Superstars competition with a score of 26 points, earning \$7,800.

SUPERSTARS COMPETITORS CONTINUED



Elvin Hayes (b.1945) American professional basketball player, Elvin Hayes was often times called "The Big E". He played power forward and center for the San Diego/Houston Rockets and for the Baltimore/Capital/Washington Bullets. Hayes was inducted into the Basketball Hall of Fame in 1990, and had his #44 jersey retired by the Houston Rockets in 2022. Hayes finished sixth in the Superstars competition with a score of 24, earning \$7,200.



Rod Gilbert (1941-2021) A Canadian professional ice hockey forward who played his entire career with the N.Y. Rangers. Known as "Mr. Ranger", Rod was inducted into the Hockey Hall of Fame in 1982. He was the first Ranger to have his number (#7) retired in 1979. Rod placed seventh in the Superstars competition with a score of 17 1/2 points, earning \$5,250.



Jim Stefanich (b.1941) American right-handed ten pin bowler known for his dominance of the sport for many years (1965-1988) in the Professional Bowlers Association tour. He won 14 PBA Tour titles, and 2 major championships. He was inducted into the PBA Hall of Fame in 1980, and the USBA Hall of Fame in 1983. Stefanich tied with Gilbert for seventh place in the Superstars competition with a score of 17 1/2, earning \$5,250.



Joe Frazier (1944-2011) An American heavyweight champion known as "Smokin" Joe". Joe Frazier competed in the sport from 1965–1981. He came to prominence when he became the first boxer to defeat Muhammad Ali. Joe was known for his strength, durability, and his punishing left hand. Joe was inducted into the International Boxing Hall of Fame in 1990. He placed ninth in the Superstars competition with a score of 12 points, earning \$3,600.



Johnny Unitas (1933-2002) American football player who played in the NFL for 18 seasons. He played primarily with the Baltimore Colts. He led the Colts to three NFL championships (1958,1959,1968), and one Super Bowl victory in 1971. Unitas was inducted into the Football Hall of Fame in 1979. He tied with Frazier for ninth place in the Superstars competition with a score of 12 points, earning \$3,600.

Is Your Neighborhood Vulnerable?

Crime feeds on apathy. If people simply "mind their own business," their entire neighborhood is vulnerable. *Is your neighborhood vulnerable?* Take the following test to help determine if your neighborhood is vulnerable.

- 1. Do you know all your neighbors?
- 2. Do you watch your neighbors' houses when they are away?
- 3. Do your neighbors watch your home when you are away?
- 4. Do you and your neighbors work together on neighborhood problems?
- 5. If you hear or see something suspicious, do you call the police?
- 6. Is your active involvement in your neighborhood and community important?

As a Neighborhood Watch member, you are responsible for being a good neighbor by watching out for others' properties and reporting suspicious activity to the police. You should know at least the three neighbors across the street from your home, your neighbors on each side, and the three neighbors behind your residence.

No police department can effectively protect life and property without the support and cooperation of the citizens it serves. They need your eyes and ears.

Every citizen should be a Neighborhood Watch member; get your neighbors to join....We need concerned, public-spirited persons who watch their neighborhood and report criminal activity.

FACT VS. MYTH

MYTH: Neighborhood Watch areas do not work.

<u>FACT:</u> Working programs reduce crime as much as 80%. Criminals have said that the Neighborhood Watch programs scare them into other neighborhoods.

MYTH: Neighborhood Watch areas are nothing more than a clique.

<u>FACT:</u> Neighborhood Watch groups are for everyone, and everyone gets to take part.

MYTH: To be a part of a Neighborhood Watch group, I would have to drop out of something else.

<u>FACT:</u> Neighborhood watch takes very little of your time; <u>just two hours s month</u>. All you need to do is watch what is going on, report suspicious activity that you see in your area, and attend any neighborhood meetings.

MYTH: The RWA and the Sheriff's Office runs your Neighborhood Watch program.

<u>FACT:</u> Your Neighborhood Watch program belongs to you. We are a separate entity and ONLY work with the Sheriff's Office.

Talk with your neighbors, talk with your friends, and ask them to join you in preventing crime. Remember without volunteers, we would not exist. Being said, we Welcome our newest member---Lee Miller of the Broadmoor/Long Meadow area.

Broadmoor Park has tremendous value as a habitat for wildlife. The lakes (three of which have good water quality), along with the Long Leaf and Slash Pines, Live Oaks, and Prairie offer good opportunities to see wildlife.

Broadmoor Park is listed as an iNaturalist Project area to document flora and fauna found by iNaturalist participants. This project was established by the University of Florida Wildlife Ecologist Mark Hoestedler, who surveyed Broadmoor Park in 2018. He set up the iNaturalist Broadmoor Park project in 2021.
