- Collected and processed 38 estoppels so far this month

- Processed and mailed out 36 new homeowner packets so far this month
- Processed 191 parking passes and additional permits so far this month
- Sent out 5 notices of intent to Claim Liens on members with past-due accounts
- Sent out 5 notices of intent to Foreclose Liens on members with past-due accounts
- Received approximately 7595 assessment payments. Due to Hurricane lan, The Rotonda West Association Assessments were due on February 1, 2023. Please get in touch with <u>Sheryl@rotondawest.org</u> to make other arrangements if payment assistance is needed or help is needed making a payment
- Currently, there are 4,200 Constant Contact Members signed up to receive important updates and Meeting information
- The Residential Modification Committee has been working hard to process and approve **387** applications this month. <u>Please make sure to complete your entire Residential Modification Application so that we can process it efficiently, and it will be approved.</u>
- Continuing collection efforts by calling members with past-due account balances, collecting 6 past-due payments this week, collecting approximately \$4300

- Hauled away 100 cubic yards of miscellaneous debris along the roads, right of ways, and the common areas in the Oakland Hills, Pebble Beach, Pinehurst, and Broadmoor sections
- Adding mulch and treating the weeds around the segment signs on Rotonda Circle
- Replaced a zone valve and added an irrigation line to help water the butterfly garden at Broadmoor Park
- Broke down and set up tables and chairs for 1 Board Meeting, 3 Committee Meetings, 20 club and activity meetings
- Mowed and trimmed 1 residential property under Section 16. In the Pinehurst section that is neglected (they are being charged for our services and fined) https://rotondawest.org/wp-content/uploads/2021/09/P-P-1.6.pdf
- Removed 275 cubic yards of fallen debris and dead trees along the Boundary Blvd Greenbelts in the Broadmoor, LongMeadow, White Marsh, and Pine Valley sections


# BELIEVE HIM, THE — IS OF INCREDIBLE CONSEQUENCE

You might have to be a retired Brown University physics professor to fully understand the most important minus sign in the universe but you can still enjoy being exposed to new ideas and to grasp the wonder of science.

In less than the advertised 90 minutes, Frank Levin took his audience of some 25 Rotonda residents back to 1859 when a German physicist named Gustav Kirchoff did for physics what Charles Darwin did for biology. Kirchoff was noted for his spectrum analysis of the composition of the Sun that, in short, allows scientists to apply terrestrial laws to understand the universe.

From there, the audience went to nature's simplest atom, hydrogen. Working with the simple atom hydrogen was important in introducing its Quantum number makeup. Levin next introduced his audience to Wolfgang Pauli, author of the Pauli Exclusion Principle that applies to Quantum numbers and says: no two electrons in an atom could have identical sets of quantum numbers




Retired Brown University physics professor Frank Levin discusses, "The Most Important Minus Sign in the Universe."

Once the Pauli Principle was introduced, the audience met Russian chemist Dimitri Mendeleev. In 1869, Mendeleev not only devised the Table of Periodic Elements in use today, he predicted elements that were as yet undiscovered.

You may need to be a Brown University professor to make the leap from these set of facts to the topics of the day's lecture (The Most Important Minus Sign in the Universe), but when Levin says "it gives rise to life as we know it" and the sign is of "the most incredible consequence" there is no reason to doubt.

In June, Levin plans to lecture on the topic of Global Warming.





# CANDIDATES NEEDED FOR NEXT ELECTION CYCLE



# SLIM CROWD HEARS FIRE DEPARTMENT TALK

Only about 23 Rotonda West residents turned out on Thursday evening, April 27, at the RWA Community Center, to hear an informative presentation about the Charlotte County Fire Department, which serves Rotonda, and enjoy delicious ice cream sundaes provided by RWA and served by members of the Community Outreach Committee. The presentation, by Todd Dunn, Public Information Officer for the Department, described in some detail the organization and mission of the Fire Department, including Emergency Medical Services (EMS).

According to Mr. Dunn, the Department, under the direction of Fire Chief/County Public Safety Director Jason Fair, employs 278 firefighters and 22 civilian support personnel, at 17 firehouses located throughout Charlotte County and adjoining municipalities. In 2022, they responded to 37,868 emergency calls, an increase of 20 percent over five years ago.

Firefighters in Charlotte County, as elsewhere, may be faced with a variety of difficult and dangerous specialized scenarios. For this reason, County firefighters, depending on assignment, may be trained in a variety of special operations, including hazardous materials and structural collapse, and extrication/rescue from situations involving confined spaces or heavy machinery. In addition, at four sites near the water, personnel are trained in marine operations, including water and dive rescue, marine fire, and barrier island response. Other specialized areas of operation include aircraft crash response, rescue and firefighting. The Department's Training Division is responsible for providing appropriate training in all these areas.

In addition to discussing the Department's operations and training, Mr. Dunn described several ways in which local residents can prepare for fires and medical emergencies. He emphasized that firefighters and EMS personnel must be able to find you if they are to help you. It is important that your house number be plainly visible and in a contrasting color to its background. The County can provide reflective and highly visible address signs at a cost of \$25.00, as well as Save Our Pets signs. He also discussed the care and maintenance of smoke detectors and the ways the Fire Department can assist residents with this

### National Safe Boating Week


May 20-26, 2023

#### **How Effective is Neighborhood Watch?**

Neighborhood Watch is an organized group of citizens devoted to crime prevention within Rotonda West. Members of a given community agree together to keep an eye on one another's properties, patrolling the street – and reporting suspicious incidents to the police. Neighborhood Watch is a community crime prevention program that was launched in 1981 to encourage citizens to look out for each other, work on neighborhood problems, and make themselves safer.

Neighborhood Watch is undoubtedly one of history's oldest and most well-known crime prevention programs. The aim of our group is to promote education for residents and have a safe and secure neighborhood. In general, when criminal activity is suspected, members are encouraged to report it to authorities, and not to intervene. Neighborhood Watch strives to promote awareness and efficiency when acting on suspicious activity. With such large investments and resources from the community, it is important to ask: <u>are community watch programs effective in reducing crime?</u>

The answer is "YES". Charlotte County Sheriff's Department consistently states that Rotonda West is one of the safest places to live in the county.

No matter how many police patrols go through our community daily, we need Patrols and Base Stations to assist CCSO. No one knows their neighborhood better than the people who live there; that means "You". Neighborhood Watch members will take turns watching a street or designated area of the community. Upon noticing suspicious activity or an emergency, the group will contact authorities to mitigate the issue. Sometimes, Neighborhood Watch members will create the illusion of occupancy for members of the community who are out of town. This includes removing newspapers from outside neighbors' homes when they are away, parking a car in the driveway, mowing the lawn, and filling up trash cans

Talk with your neighbors, talk with your friends, and ask them to join you in preventing crime. Remember without volunteers, we would not exist. Being said, we Welcome our newest member----Wally Chan of the Oakland Hills/Pebble Beach area.

If you are looking to volunteer as a Patrol or be a Base Station it just takes two hours a month; a small commitment to protecting our neighborhoods.
