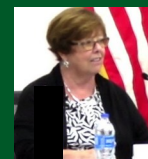

THE ABC'S AND XYZ'S OF YOUR HANDWRITING

In this presentation we will look at the way we were taught to write in cursive or print and why that style may or may not differ today.

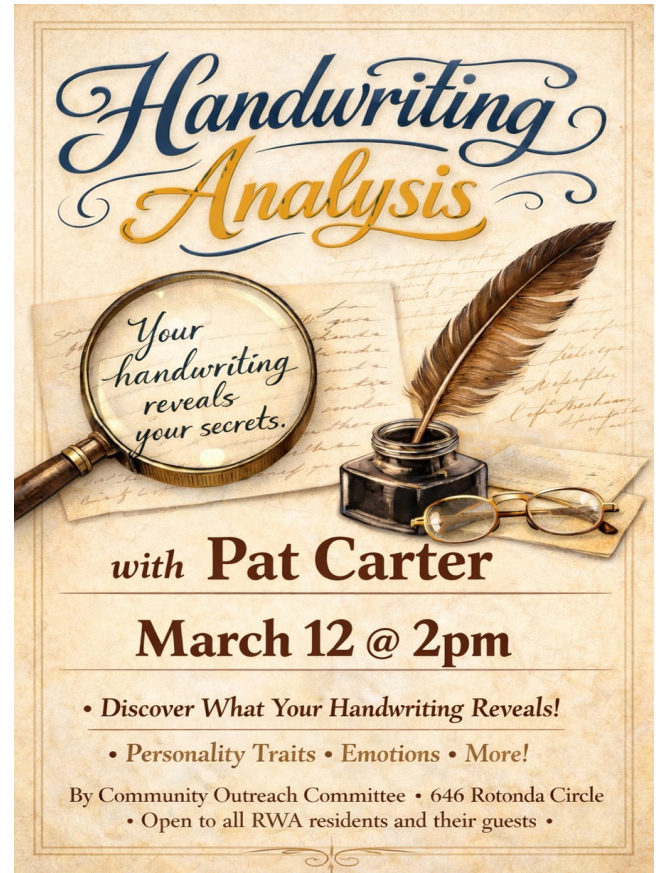
Handwriting Analysis examines everything we put on a page as if it were a blank slate. It includes where we begin to write on a page and our preference for lined or unlined paper and how we form the shape of our letters and the spaces between them. By measuring distances between our letters, words, and lines, we can learn conscious and unconscious patterns of behavior. All of these offer a deeper understanding of ourselves, family and others.

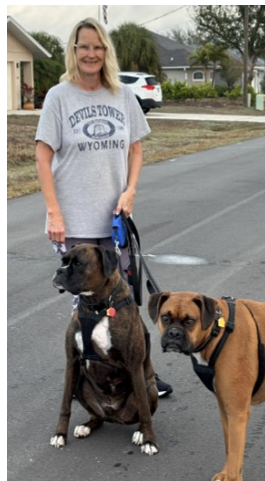

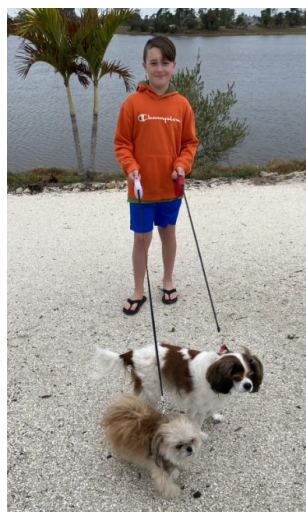

GARDEN TIP FOR MARCH

If a butterfly could design its own habitat, it would probably be a sunny meadow with some three foot high red flowers swaying above the grasses. Florida native tropical sage (*Salvia coccinea*) would perfectly fill the bill. One self-sowing plant will become many with irresistible scarlet flowers, attracting bees and even hummingbirds.

Plant the white version of tropical sage nearby, and the plants sometimes produce pink flowers. The tubular 1 inch flowers appear pretty much year round. This perennial is drought tolerant once established, needing only deadheading after the seeds drop. A hardy member of the mint family, tropical sage is cold tolerant, but takes a winter break from blooming.

Lyreleaf sage (*Salvia lyrata*) would be a grand addition to that butterfly meadow. This native groundcover has oval shaped leaves with a decorative reddish pattern on the green rosette. In spring a 1 foot flower stalk produces pale blue or lavender flowers. The seeds are plentiful and will offer food for birds, as well as new plants. Not fussy about soil, lyreleaf sage is happy in sun or part shade, sand or even clay. It thrives in a wildflower lawn, tolerating foot traffic and even mowing. In my garden lyreleaf sage even grows in the beach pebble. Also in the mint family, lyreleaf sage is a nectar source for pollinators.

With this column, I will pass the trowel to Merrill Horswill, a Florida Master Naturalist with an extensive native plant garden. Merrill also helps manage the Broadmoor Park Butterfly and Native Plant gardens and she has arranged for many of the speakers we have enjoyed through the Community Outreach Committee.

About 12 percent of nonnative plants in Florida are considered invasive or even prohibited. These invasive species spread aggressively, harm native ecosystems and resist eradication efforts. The Florida Invasive Species Council lists a staggering 166 invasive plants. Learn how to identify (some are sold in stores!) and remove the worst invasive plants and discover beautiful native plants to replace them.

Some of the worst are: Airpotato, Asparagus fern, Australian pine, Brazilian pepper, Carrotwood, Golden rain tree, Lantana camera (above), Mexican petunia (left), Orchid tree, Rosary pea, Wedelia. Learn steps to fight these aggressive weeds and nurture beautiful

native plants that support wildlife such as beach sunflower, beautyberry, cocoplum, fire bush (below), native lantana, oak, sabal palm, slash pine, tropical sage.

Land managers are stewards of Charlotte County's natural areas, 12 properties purchased through Conservation Charlotte, environmental parks, mitigation sites and acquisition parcels. They manage these areas to protect and preserve native ecosystems, particularly keystone species such as gopher tortoises. They restore sensitive habitats by managing invasive species, conducting prescribed burns to clear undergrowth and monitoring listed species such as scrub jays. They also provide recreational, health and wellness opportunities for the public by maintaining trails, creating educational materials such as signs and booklets. A big part of the land manager's job is to educate the public about these properties and the flora and fauna that live there. We are fortunate to have so many natural areas in Charlotte County and the land managers who care for them.

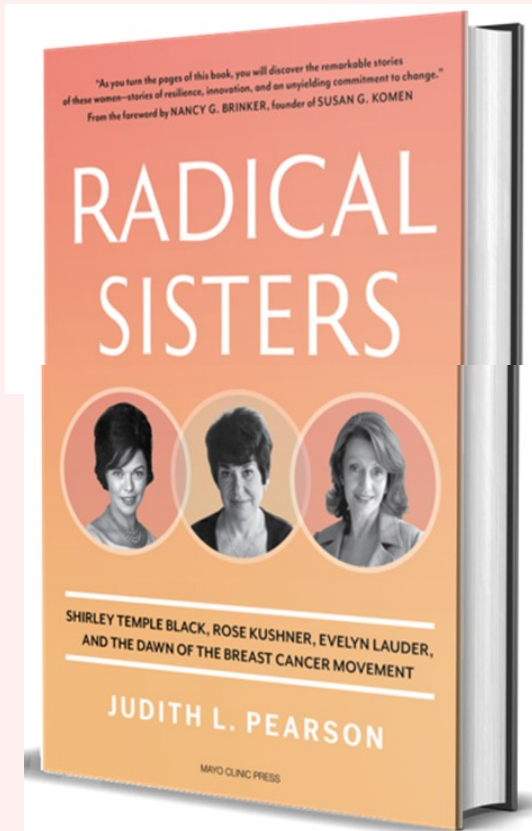

GPS/Navigation for Mariners – US Coast Guard Approved Boating Safety Course

PORT CHARLOTTE, FL – March 21, 2026 – The U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary is offering a GPS/Navigation for Mariners course designed to enhance the navigational skills of local boaters. This comprehensive, one-day course will be held on Saturday, March 21, 2026, from 8:30 AM to 3:30 PM at the South Gulf Cove HOA Building, located at 14859 Ingraham Blvd, Port Charlotte, FL 33981.

Taught by experienced U.S. Coast Guard Auxiliary Instructors, this course will provide attendees with essential knowledge of traditional and modern navigational techniques. Instructors familiar with Gasparilla Sound, Pine Island Sound, Boca Grande, South Charlotte Harbor, South Gulf Cove, and surrounding waterways will guide participants through both fundamental and advanced navigation principles.

The first part of the course will focus on basic navigational skills, including:

- Reading and interpreting nautical charts
- Determining location and depth
- Identifying aids to navigation (ATONS)
- Recognizing hazards and features helpful to navigation
- Calculating compass bearings, distances, speed, and time for navigation.

The second portion will introduce modern Global Positioning Systems (GPS) as a navigational aid, covering:

- *Using GPS to determine location
- Storing and using waypoints, routes, and tracks
- Applying GPS for trip planning and execution.

While the course will provide a general understanding of GPS navigation, it will not be specific to any particular brand or model of equipment.

CHARLOTTE COUNTY NEWS ITEMS-MARCH 2026

- Charlotte County Commissioners unanimously voted on Wednesday February 25, 2026 to begin the work to REPLACE the Rotonda Boulevard South Bridge due to damage from Hurricane Ian (3 years and 5 months ago!). The latest offer from FEMA is \$769K, well short of the latest estimate of \$2.7 million. The additional \$2 million funds shall come from the MSBU. Meanwhile, Charlotte County shall continue to discuss with FEMA in an attempt to secure MORE funding, possibly thru another lawsuit. Also, the Army Corps of Engineers needs to provide a PERMIT. What happens now is that the engineering specification to REPLACE the bridge shall soon be sent to responsible bridge construction firms for their bids. Bid review should be in the next 60 days and perhaps actual groundbreaking and WORK might start in the May/June 2026 timeframe. The estimated construction time to REPLACE the bridge is approximately 9 months so the completion and opening of the bridge is estimated for the 2nd quarter of 2027. Information shall be updated monthly in this newsletter.

The RW S&D MSBU unanimous motion to MILL & GRIND Rotonda Circle was REJECTED by the Charlotte County Commissioners.

- Traffic lights at Gasparilla & Ingram/Ingraham are also to be installed in the 2Q 2026.
- Remaining 4 bridges, (#110-#111-#112-#123) are scheduled for 3Q/4Q 2026 & 1Q of 2027.
- *US Government shutdown(43 days + 19 days) may affect completion of these items!!!
- Watering restrictions are in effect due to the severe drought conditions, check with CHARLOTTE COUNTY UTILITIES website for specific information. WATER 1 DAY A WEEK!
